## July 2025 NC Medicaid Preferred Drug List Formulary Changes



The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services established the NC Medicaid Preferred Drug List (PDL) to allow NC Medicaid to ensure access to cost-efficient, medically appropriate drug therapies that maximize patient health outcomes for all beneficiaries. ## **CHANGES EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025**

- New additions to the preferred formulary:
  - o Erzofri (paliperidone palmitate)
- New additions to the non-preferred formulary:
  - o Tramadol 75 mg tablet
  - Opipza (aripiprazole) ODT
  - Sacubitril/valsartan tablet
  - Verapamil SR capsule
  - Edaravone vial
  - Exenatide pen
  - Timolol solution
  - Ohtuvayre (ensifentrine) solution
  - o Twyneo (tretinoin and benzoyl peroxide) cream
  - o Aklief (trifarotene) cream
  - o Elimite (permethrin) cream
  - Ebglyss (lebrikizumab-Ibkz) injection
  - o Nemluvio (nemolizumab-ilto) injection
  - Simlandi (adalimumab-ryvk) injection
  - Neffy (epinephrine) nasal spray
- Preferred/non-preferred changes:
  - Banzel to non-preferred; rufinamide to preferred
  - Humalog 75/25 to non-preferred; insulin lispro protamine 75/25 to preferred
  - DermaSmoothe FS Scalp and Body Oil to non-preferred; fluocinolone body and scalp oil to preferred
